History of Cincinnati Music: The Other King Records

Presented by Uncle Dave Lewis

King Records is best known for its achievements in recording Hillbilly music, Rhythm and Blues and James Brown, mostly at the old icehouse on Brewster Ave. In his presentation, The 'Other' King Records, music historian Uncle Dave Lewis will explore the acquisition of other labels by King owner Syd Nathan, work done in studios other than Brewster and the initiatives King Records took into pop, gospel, jazz, comedy and international music.

David N. "Uncle Dave" Lewis has been an ARSC member since 1999. He has presented at several ARSC Conferences since giving his first talk in Santa Barbara in 2002. Today he presents monthly lectures at the Public Library of Cincinnati and Hamilton County on topics relating to the music and recording industry in the Ohio Valley, and is an historian and producer for WVXU, the NPR affiliate in Cincinnati. His radio piece on bandleader Earl Fuller won an "Excellence in Journalism" award from the Society for Professional Journalists.
