### OVERVIEW

The Association for Recorded Sound Collections Board of Directors invites you to attend the 46<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference in Rochester, New York, on May 16-19, 2012, hosted by the Eastman School of Music.

### HOTEL

Conference sessions will be held at the **Rochester Riverside Radisson**, located in the heart of downtown Rochester, a short walk from the Eastman School of Music. Our contracted dates at the Rochester Riverside Radisson are Tuesday May 15 through Saturday May 19, 2012. Group rates will be honored 3 days before/after these dates pending availability. The deadline to make reservations at the Radisson is Tuesday, **April 24, 2012**. Reservations made after this date will be reserved only on a space available basis at the prevailing rate. ### ROOMMATE CLEARINGHOUSE

**TRAVEL** (see the Travel section of the website for additional maps and links)

The Greater Rochester International Airport (ROC) is serviced by Air Canada, AirTran, American, Continental, Delta, Jet Blue, United, and US Airways. Amtrak also offers service to Rochester from New York, Philadelphia, Boston, Cleveland, and other cities in the region. The Radisson Rochester Riverside provides complimentary shuttle service to/from the airport as well as the Amtrak station. At the airport, use the hotel courtesy phone on the lower level near baggage claim, or call 585-475-1910.

Most of the major car rental companies operate from ROC's property, including Avis, Budget, Enterprise, Hertz, National, and Thrifty (Alamo has a shuttle to its offsite location). From the airport it is approximately 4.6 miles (10-12 minutes) to the Radisson.

## **PARKING**

Conference attendees who are staying at the Radisson Rochester Riverside will receive complimentary garage parking (the daily fee will be waived upon check-in); all others may park at the Radisson's attached garage for the conference day rate of \$7.00 (plus taxes).

## **WEATHER**

The average high temperature in Rochester in May is nearly 70 degrees and the average low temperature is in the mid-40s. May is typically a relatively dry month with less than 3 inches of rain.

## **OPTIONAL WEDNESDAY TOUR – IMAGE PERMANENCE INSTITUTE**

The Image Permanence Institute is offering a 90 minute tour of their 7000 sq. ft. facility on the campus of the Rochester Institute of Technology—one of the finest and best-equipped centers in the world for testing imaging and recording materials and for conducting preservation research. The lab is divided into several distinct areas: a state of the art imaging and microscopy lab; an incubation laboratory with thirteen temperature/humidity chambers and two dry ovens; a light fading lab; as well as a chemistry lab, instrumentation lab, and pollution studies lab. The tour will be held Wednesday May 16, from 3-5:30 p.m. Participants should meet in the Radisson Lobby at 3 p.m. to catch a chartered shuttle for the 20-minute ride to IPI; the bus will return to the hotel around 5:30 p.m. The IPI tour is limited to 35 participants; there is a \$10 per person fee to cover transportation (the tour will be filled on a first-come first-served basis and may be cancelled if there are fewer than 10 participants, in which case fees will be refunded).

## **OPTIONAL POST CONFERENCE SUNDAY TOUR – SENECA LAKE WINE TRAIL**

Take a guided tour of the beautiful Seneca Lake region on Sunday May 20 from 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. Located in the heart of New York's Finger Lakes Region, the area offers gorgeous waterfalls, magnificent parks and charming villages. Seneca Lake Wine Trail's 34 member wineries have won hundreds of medals and are recognized as world-class producers of Riesling, Pinot Gris, Gewurztraminer, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, and Honey Wines (Meads). ARSC members Jim Farrington and Garrett Bowles will lend their expertise by suggesting which vineyards to visit. Capacity of the chauffeured minibus is 11 people; pick up/drop off will be at the Radisson. The fee will range from \$50-90 per person depending upon the number of reservations (not including tips, food, wine, which is typically \$1 per glass in the tasting rooms). ## **CONFERENCE SESSIONS**

All sessions are scheduled from Thursday through Saturday in the conference center on the second level of the hotel. Each day of the conference will begin with a special plenary session of general interest, followed by two concurrent sessions, each targeted to different interest groups. Complete session abstracts will be available on the conference website and printed in the final program. On Thursday night there will be a Technical Committee Open Meeting with Q&A, and on Friday night we're planning a film screening at the hotel followed by the annual Collectors' Roundtable meeting.

## **AWARDS BANQUET**

The conference will conclude on Saturday evening with the annual Awards Banquet in the hotel's Genesee Suite, preceded by a Happy Hour beginning at 6 p.m. Winners of the 2011 and 2012 ARSC Awards will be honored.
