CURRENT BIBLIOGRAPHY

Compiled by Tim Brooks

Following is a selective bibliography of articles on recording history which have appeared recently. The intent is to help readers follow the latest research in the field, much of which appears in small, unfamiliar publications. Individual and institutional ARSC members are encouraged to subscribe to and communicate with these journals, to help improve the exchange of information between researchers in the recording field.

The criteria for inclusion of articles here is necessarily somewhat subjective, however the intent is to list any serious research on recording history. Articles which are primarily musicological or sociological in nature, and those dealing with current subjects (collectors' news, reviews, current recording industry and artists) are not included. Issues covered are those received between November 1979 and March 1980.

A change from the previous format is that artist biographies and interviews are listed alphabetically at the head of each section. "W/D" indicates that the article is accompanied by a discography, although this is often no more than a simple list of issued recordings, by catalog number.

Members' comments on this department—and volunteers to compile the various sections—are solicited.
