#### CURRENT BIBLIOGRAPHY

Compiled by Tim Brooks

This is a selective listing of recent English-language articles dealing with recording history. It is intended to help ARSC members find the important research that often appears in small, unfamiliar publications. Members are encouraged to subscribe or to communicate with the publications within their area of interest. Your involvement helps further our goal of encouraging research and bettering communications between researchers.

To be included here, articles must be reasonably original and concern recording history—not musicological, sociological or current subjects (such as reviews, etc.) Current Bibliography supplements the Bibliography of Discographies in that non-discographical articles are included, and it is sufficiently current so that most of the issues listed should still be available from the publishers. "W/D" indicates that the article includes a discography, although this is often no more than a simple list of releases by catalog number.

Issues covered are those received between January and June 1982.

## What's New?

ARSC member David Ginsburg of Central Michigan University conducts two columns in <u>Goldmine</u> which should be extremely useful to the librarian and collector. "The Reference Library" contains detailed reviews and listings of currently available reference books dealing with popular music and jazz. "Fandomania" keeps track of the dozens (hundreds?) of ephemeral rock collectors' publications which appear and disappear with startling regularity.

Another source of information on research publications is an article by B. Lee Cooper in <u>JEMF Quarterly</u>, Summer 1981, summarizing ten years of rock bibliographies (1970-1979). The annotated listings covers 55 published bibliographies.

The first article resulting from a project supported (modestly) by an ARSC Research Grant appears in the current <u>Popular Music & Society</u>. See under "Popular, General - Other Articles." The maximum grant limit was raised last year to \$250, however, few applications have been received recently by the Grants Committee. Interested researchers should write to J.F. Weber, Chairman of the Committee, directly or through the Executive Secretary.

<u>Goldmine's</u> subsidiary magazine for "78" collectors, <u>Classic Wax</u>, has folded after five issues. One hopes that Mike Biel's fiery letter to the editor over the magazine's discographical standards didn't sink the ship! <u>Goldmine</u> itself is booming, however, with a reported 15,000

subscribers at present. This 200-page combination research and record sales monthly has published a huge number of valuable discographies and other articles in the past few years--mostly in, though not limited to, the rock and blues fields. It belongs in every library concerned with current popular music research.

Storyville, the venerable English jazz publication, has reached issue #100; included in that number is an index of all major articles contained in the first 100 issues (1965-1982). The even more venerable classical publication The Record Collector recently reached its 35th anniversary, whereupon editor James F. E. Dennis was feted at a banquet. Mike Gray has something to look forward to if he hangs on long enough!

The Phonogram, journal of the Phonograph Society of New Zealand, is included here for the first—and probably last—time. The first issue received by this compiler (Nov. 1981) contained a notice stating that the magazine was ceasing publication. Helpfully, the editor included a listing of other "78" collector's magazines around the world to which his bereft readers might turn.

Finally, confusion apparently reigns at <u>Nostalgia World</u>, which recently put out two consecutive issue #16's. They are differentiated here by the internal dates, "Winter 1981" and "Winter 1981-81", respectively.
