# CURRENT BIBLIOGRAPHY

#### Compiled by Tim Brooks

This is a selective listing of recent English-language articles dealing with recording history. It is intended to help ARSC members find the important research that is scattered in small, often unfamiliar publications. Readers are encouraged to subscribe to and communicate with these magazines. Your personal involvement helps further our association's goal of encouraging research and bettering communication between researchers.

In order to be included here, articles must be reasonably original and deal with recording history--not with musicological, sociological or current subjects (such as LP reviews, etc.) <u>Current Bibliography</u> supplements <u>The Bibliography of Discographies</u> in that non-discographical articles are included here, and this column is sufficiently current that most of the issues listed should still be available from the publishers. "W/D" means that the article includes a discography, although this is often no more than a simple list of releases by catalog number.

Issues covered are those received between October 1982 and January 1983.

### Some Notes

For those who may have missed it, <u>Goldmine</u>--the largest (15,000 circulation) and best of the rock research journals--included in its February 1983 issue a lengthy article on ARSC and its activities, by this writer. I hope this article will help raise awareness of the association among some of the more serious rock researchers, who have had almost no contact with ARSC up to now. The article included illustrations of filming underway for the AAA record indexing project.

<u>Trouser Press</u>, a contemporary rock publication, has been running articles which are an interesting variation on the discographical approach to an artist's history. Its "autodiscographies" are basically interviews in which the artist is taken through each of his or her principal recordings, in chronological order, and asked to comment on each. This is not really a discography of course, but it does dredge up some interesting background information on the creative process, and how a project may have been influenced by previous sessions.

Finally, I would like to repeat that readers are encouraged to write this department about any worthwhile discographies or articles on recording history which they may find in current publications not listed here. Please cite the issue number and address of the publication, so that it can be properly credited. As always, editors of the magazines are invited to submit issues for listing (though precious few have been willing to do so thus far!).
