## INFORMATION FOR CONTRIBUTORS

1. Articles, letters and other material for the Journal should be sent to the ARSC President Don McCormick, Rodgers & Hammerstein Archives, New York Public Library, 111 Amsterdam Avenue, New York, NY 10023. Articles or other submissions should include the author's name and mailing address. When there are co-authors, please show which is the receive proofs for correction.

2. The Journal follows <u>Webster's Third New International</u> <u>Dictionary of the English Language</u> for usage and spelling, and <u>The Chicago Manual of Style</u>, 13th ed., especially for capitalization, punctuation, and footnotes and bibliographies in the humanities.

3. All material may be submitted either as typescript or in computer-readable form, though computer-readable form is preferable. Typescripts must be provided in duplicate (carbon or Xerox-type copies are acceptable) and should be double-spaced with numbered pages and at least one-inch margins on all sides. Notes should be numbered consecutively throughout the manuscript and typed on a separate page. Computer text files must be submitted on IBM PC-compatible diskettes--WordStar, WordPerfect, or unformatted ASCII (with word-wrap, please!) are acceptable-accompanied by a print-out. Diskettes will be returned.

4. Article-length discographies and bibliographies, when accepted for publication, must be provided either in computer-readable form (see 3 above) or in camera-ready copy--that is, clean typescript laid out in the Journal's type format, ready to be photographed and published. A guide to the Journal's type design will be sent to those preparing camera-ready copy.

5. Please submit illustrations with the manuscript. Halftones (e.g., photographs) should be submitted as glossy photographic prints. Line art such as drawings, charts, and musical examples must be in black ink with clear and "open" lettering--typed, when possible--and large enough not to require photographic enlargement. Illustrations that reproduce poorly will not be accepted. Please number the illustrations, supply a list, and identify them in the text. Every attempt will be made to include illustrations within the text.

6. Contributors must obtain permission to quote from copyright sources and to reproduce copyright illustrations. Copies of the permission grants must be provided to the Editor, and credits as required by the grantors must be given in the notes.
