The Victor Master Book and Related Matters

Walter C. Allen, well-known jazz discographer and seller of books on matters discographical announces renewed availability of the Brian Rust <u>Victor Master Book - Vol. 2,</u> (1925-1936), covering matrix and catalog numbers for Victor non-Red Seal electrical 78's, complete with tune-title and artist index (price \$12.50, P. O. Box 501, Stanhope, N.J. 07874).

W. T. Moran and Ted Fagan are hard at work on the Red Seal counterpart of Rust's <u>Victor Master Book</u>, working directly from the official Victor recording ledgers. Plans call for Mr. Rust to undertake publication of the **massive** Moran-Fagan documentation.

Mengelberg Buffs, Take Note!

The movement on the part of private collector groups to gather and coordinate materials and information on major recording artists heretofore overlooked in terms of intensive research and information dissemination proceeds apace on both sides of the Atlantic, with orchestral conductors receiving the lion's share of attention.
