### AN INDEX TO COMMERCIAL SPOKEN WORD RECORDINGS

## IN THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS

This index is intended to begin filling in some of the gaps in the information currently available concerning the existence of actual recordings of voices and events of documentary/historical value on commercial long-playing records. Originally conceived as an informal, in-house reference aid, full indexing and annotation at first was not stressed. Because of the limited time available when this project was first undertaken, the primary emphasis was placed on only two items: what existed and where it could be located. As the index expanded, however, its value became quite apparent, more so in fact than had been originally estimated. I therefore started to annotate the entries for each recording as fully as possible, and in order to make this present edition of the index as comprehensive as possible, I have attempted to annotate as many entries as I could that previously contained no explanatory notation. This was done not only with the aid of liner notes and whatever transcription notes were contained in each record, but also by listening to each record and jotting down notes. As interested readers of this index will note, however, it was not possible to do this for all entries. space limitations were both factors which inhibited the provision of more detailed information for some of the 71 records included in this index. Therefore. for those readers who have questions concerning any of the entries in the index, I will be more than happy to reply to inquiries directed to me here at the Library.

Of course, not all commercial records concerned with documentary/historical information are included in this present index. Because the index was originally intended to deal specifically with the archival collections at the Library of Congress, the Library's holdings comprise the majority of the entries. With

the expansion of the index other records concerning documentary spoken word recordings have been included besides those in the Library's collections. Hopefully, interested users of this index will inform me of additional recordings that should be included in this index. Information concerning such recordings should contain the name of the publisher and/or producer of the record; the record number; issue date of the record, if possible; complete contents of the record with the names of the speakers, the topics covered, and the duration and date of the speech, if such data is indicated.

Those recordings and anthologies listed under the term "documentary/historical" contain, for the most part, the voices of three or more different persons, including various statesmen, politicians, and leaders of countries, as well as notable figures in other fields such as art, sports, literature, theater and religion. Recordings concerning famous events, either the actual sounds of the event itself or a description of it, are also found among the entries. For the most part these entries are only short statements or brief excerpts from speeches, interviews, radio and television broadcasts, and sound tracks: for very rarely do the anthologies contain complete recordings of speeches or events. The majority of the entries are listed as they are currently accepted and established in the Library and its Official Catalog. Those entries for which the Library has not established an official form of entry are listed as they appear on the record or on the item in hand.

While eliminating the majority of known "faked" recordings, I did include a few, indicating the fact that the recording is either a dramatization or a reading. This was done in order to point out that such recordings are not what they purport to be. For instance, the McKinley recordings are read by actor Len. G. Spencer, but for years they were considered to be actual recordings of McKinley's voice. To date there is no known recording of the President's voice. This also holds true for Grover Cleveland. Of course, while I have attempted to list only actual voices and sounds (unless otherwise noted), there is always the possibility that some additional entries are in fact either reconstructions or readings. Should a doubt

arise in the mind of any interested reader concerning the authenticity of the voice or sound of a particular entry, I hope he will not hesitate to so inform me so that I can research the matter further.

This discography is arranged in three parts:
(1) by album title, (2) by specific speaker or event.

(3) by manufacturer's name. The first part contains all the available information on the indexed recordings. The majority of the entries are 33 1/3 rpm recordings, although serious consideration is being given to including other commercial issues, i.e., 78 and 45 rpm, cassettes, cartridges, and reel-to-reel recordings. The numbers in Index I refer the user from the specific speaker or event to the anthology in which it is included.

For their kind and generous assistance, I would most gratefully like to thank my colleagues here at the Library: Donald Leavitt, Jim Smart, and Gerald Gibson. Without their pertinent comments and criticisms, this index would have taken much longer in coming to light. I would also like to thank Patricia Lindahl for her assistance in preparing this index for publication. This index is the first in a series to be published annually.
