This work is a very valiant effort of identifying and locating recordings of American organ music. This columnist helped somewhat in locating sources of information for this work.

Clough and Cuming, World's Encyclopaedia of Recorded Music (WERM), with first, 2nd, & 3rd supplements in reprint is now available at \$80.00 from Greenwood Press, 51 Riverside Ave., Westport, CT 06880. I had announced this some time ago and on trying to purchase the work was told it was not their title—their catalog says it is. Greenwood also has the 1948, 3rd ed. of the Gramophone Shop Encyclopedia of Recorded Music. Unknown to many library catalog departments, this third edition is a supplement to, not supplanting the 1st and 2nd editions which continue the WERM study above.

Blesh, Rudi, Shining Trumpets, 2nd ed. (reprint)
New York, Da Capo Press, 1976. pb., \$5.95.
This work in its first edition included for the time, a remarkably useful discography. Da Capo has brought out a whole jazz series including the Bibliography of Jazz by Alan P. Merriam.

These, a group of works charting the history of charted music, are described in <u>Billboard</u> in full-page advertisements and will tell you what they can do for you beyond ripping your wallet.

This is a bibliography which contains a number of holdings catalog citations of audio libraries and centers.
